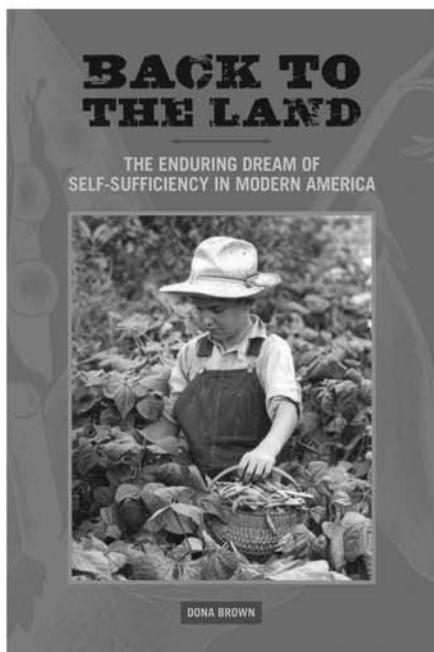

Dona Brown is associate professor of history at the University of Vermont and author of *Inventing New England: Regional Tourism in the Nineteenth Century*.

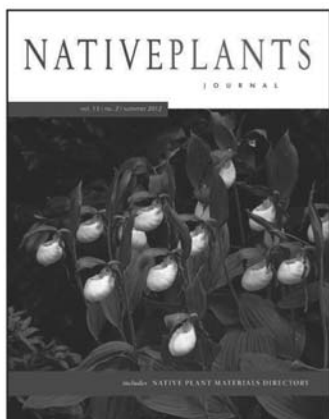
